- Encourage your child and express your pride. Nothing fosters a love for learning faster than the encouragement of a proud parent. Whether your child just learned the ABCs or finished reading a whole book, be sure to tell them what a great job they've done. Recognizing their hard work paying off will set healthy patterns for their future growth and development.
- Dramatic play has a profound effect on language and literacy development. Provide many opportunities for play by providing a variety of props and objects along with themes and pretend scenarios for your child.
- At home, parents can encourage play by creating a safe environment for your child and by playing with them! Don't think of playing as a break from learning, but rather learning itself.
